DIRECTOR'S **NOTES**



CAST

- NICODEMUS: a Jewish leader, advanced in age, religiously dressed
- JESUS: a younger teacher, with beard, and commonly attired
- HOUSEHOLD SERVANT: nondescript in every way

SETTING:

An ordinary house, in a quiet first-century town in the Levant. An older, but distinguished looking man, approaches. The sun has recently set. Light from burning candles escapes the home as the door is pulled open to him.

The man introduces himself as Nicodemus. He says he has come in hopes of having a conversation with the one called Jesus. He is invited in and given a seat at the table. Some bread is set before him. The furnishings are sparse. The house servant leaves the room and a younger bearded man enters.
